**Junior League of Boca Raton Gives Back to the Community with Grant  
to The Women's Circle, Inc.**

**Boca Raton** – Michele Weizer chair of the Junior League of Boca Raton (JLBR) Community Support Fund presented a \$2,500 check to Sister Lorraine Ryan, M.M.S., Coordinator, The Women's Circle, Inc.

The Women's Circle began in 1999 to serve the low income, impoverished women residing in Boynton Beach. The Women's Circle applied to the JLBR Community Support Fund for a grant to teach 30 women how to read in Creole, enable twelve women to complete ESOL classes, and provide fifteen women the opportunity to master basic computer skills. Other services that The Women's Circle Inc. provides are literacy classes in Creole which then progresses to ESOL, basic computer skills, job search preparation, and a dress for success closet which provides clothing for job interviews.

This grant is one of many that the JLBR Community Support Fund gives out to area non-profit organizations on an on-going basis. Since 1971, the JLBR has been an integral part of our community. This year, JLBR members will contribute more than 35,000 volunteer hours locally and donate more than \$300,000 to the South Florida community.
