In order to be considered for JLBR volunteer support, projects or events must meet the following criteria:

1. The requesting organization must be non-profit and tax-exempt.
2. The proposed project must assist women, children, or otherwise support a community service organization.
3. The proposed project or event must impact communities in south Palm Beach County and/or north Broward County.
4. Volunteer support cannot be provided for religious programs, political activities, or fundraising events held by other agencies.
5. Financial support is not available from the JLBR for the project or event.

In the next few months, over 400 JLBR members will volunteer for events to benefit The Caring Kitchen, The Morikami Museum, the Boca Raton Community Hospital, In the Pines, Habitat for Humanity, Kids in Distress, and many other local agencies.
