Today, the Junior League of Boca Raton (JLBR) is a team of nearly 700 highly motivated, committed, and influential women, who are committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women, and improving the community through effective action of trained volunteers.

JLBR COMMUNITY IMPACT

JLBR provides a positive force for change through direct service, collaborations with other community organizations, and advocacy

- Founded Boca Raton Historical Society
- Restored Singing Pines which is now Boca Raton Children's Museum
- Founded and maintain the Vegso Community Resource Center
- Founded the JLBR Diaper Bank
- Founded and manages the Boca Raton Community Garden, the largest community garden in South Florida

DEVELOPING THE POTENTIAL OF WOMEN

Members use their training, which ranges from team leadership and mentoring to communications and fundraising to further their careers, for personal growth and to improve our community through involvement with other community organizations.

- 1,268 Hours of virtual training attended by members
- 378 nonprofit training attendees
- 192 Hours of Self Esteem training for at-risk young women

HUNGER

- 12,767 Pounds of food collected
- 1,138 Pounds of fresh produce donated from the JLBR Community Garden

CHILD WELFARE

- 691,140 Diapers collected this League year
- 4,300,000 Diapers distributed since 2011
- 240,000 Diapers distributed in response to COVID-19 via emergency diaper drive
- 3,000 children served monthly

NONPROFIT SUPPORT

- 5,469 Hours of direct service through volunteer programs to our nonprofit partners
- \$10,000 in grants awarded by JLBR to community nonprofits
- 200+ nonprofits supported
- Established through the efforts of JLBR, the Grant Library at the **Vegso Community Resource Center** is part of the Funding Information Network of the Foundation Center, Inc.
